



Conversation starters to help talk about life issues.

1. How do you feel about abortion?
2. On what grounds do you believe in abortion?
 - Rape/incest – 1% of pregnancies result from this, should a child die because of the sin of his/her father?
 - Mother's life – there is the double effect principle that is acceptable – saving the mother is carried out and results in the death of the child; speak with a priest to discern this action.
3. Is the unborn human? (if answered no, continue....)
 - Is it alive in the womb? Yes, then it is life.
 - Does it come from humans? If not human then what species is it? Yes, then it is a human species
4. If abortion is healthcare, what disease is it treating?
5. Humans like you and me are valuable, so why not the unborn?
6. My body, my choice... it's actually 2 bodies – the baby is a distinct separate body growing and we are not supposed to harm others. There are all kinds of laws against harming ourselves and others – i.e. any kind of physical assault, drugs, and prostitution.
7. When you look around, who would you be ok with not being here because they were aborted?
8. Do you believe in human rights? Should an unborn child have rights? Why not?
9. Did you know life begins at conception with unique DNA?
10. Do you know someone who is adopted and do you celebrate that life?
11. Do you want to help me gather items for a pregnancy support organization?
12. Does a person's quality of life determine his/her dignity?
13. Do you know what the abortion law is in Canada? There is none – abortion is provided throughout all 9 months of pregnancy.
14. Do you think the current abortion policy reflects Canadians opinions?
15. Do you know if sex selective abortion is practiced in Canada? Yes, it is.
16. What other countries in the world practise abortion with no laws? No other democratic country practises abortion without some kind of restriction.
17. How do you feel about MAiD and assisted suicide?
18. Do you have a personal directive that prohibits medically assisted dying?
19. Do you feel informed or educated enough about abortion or MAiD?
20. What would you do if you were faced with having to provide abortion or MAiD as part of your job?
21. Do you think healthcare providers should have conscience rights and be able to opt out of providing abortion and MAiD?
22. Should a pharmacist be forced to provide abortion and assisted suicide drugs?
23. How is the current federal government accountable to reviewing MAiD and the effect of it on Canadians as promised at the time of regulation?
24. Federal parties say they will not open up the abortion debate - is this really democracy when the people want to have this conversation?
25. Have you expressed your prolife views to federal/provincial politicians, why or why not?
